DECLARING A SPANISH PREMAJOR

The majors in Spanish and Spanish in Preparation for the Single Subject Teaching Credential are impacted programs. Admission to the Spanish premajors is at the discretion of the Department of Spanish and Portuguese and the Undergraduate Adviser.

Students who wish to declare a Spanish premajor or a 2nd premajor in Spanish must meet one the following requirements:

• Spanish Foreign Language Track:

Enrolled in any lower-division courses (Span 101, 102, 201, 202, 211, or 212).

• Spanish Heritage Language Track:

Enrolled in any lower-division course, Span 281 or 282.

• International Baccalaureate or High School Spanish Advanced Placement Credits:

Credit for Spanish 201 and 211 or 202 and 212 (Scoring 3, 4, or 5 on the AP Language Exam)

• High School Equivalents:

Completed two to four years of high school Spanish.

• Community College Transfer Credit:

Transfer credit for comparable lower-division community college courses.

Spanish 202, 212 or 282 must be taken for a grade (except for AP credit). A minimum grade of C (2.0) or better is required for these Spanish classes. Also, aspiring students must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better.
